A PLACE IS A NETWORK BEFORE IT IS A PLAN

This is the first map on the lineage map engine with no music on it. The Japanese Metal Family Tree and the Tampa death metal map are The Music Cities™ content; the Creator Economy Map and the West Dixie Music Corridor map are the crossover between The Music Cities™ and Street Economics®. This one is Street Economics® only. It exists to show that the same engine works for pure economic development: a place and its economy mapped as a network and a lineage, and it gives Street Economics® Detection #3, South Dade, an evidence layer that the detection page links to.

Every node is a place, a project, a station, a road, an event, a person or family with a documented role, or an institution: an employer, an agency, a developer, a plan, a program. Nodes belong to one of ten layers of the place, not eras: towns and districts, people and population, employment anchors, transit and roads, agriculture and the Redland, parks, water and recreation, gathering places and culture, plans and agencies, development and capital, and the digital layer. A rose ring marks a documented gathering place (58 on the map). An orange dotted ring marks something Hurricane Andrew wrecked that was rebuilt or replaced (23). The 15 community hubs, the four municipalities and the census designated places, are both nodes in the towns layer and the anchors of the Cities view.

Connections come in three weights. Solid lines are the moves that carry know how and capital: a developer active on a named project, a person or firm moving between two nodes, a plan or business spawning another, a founder, a predecessor becoming a successor (198 on the map). Dashed lines are influence, used only where a source says one thing shaped another (50). Dotted lines are plans, funding, anchoring, stations and roads connecting places, partnerships and hosting (273). A fourth, fainter class ties every node to the community it sits in (290); it is off by default on the interactive map and excluded from the centrality calculation, because every node is located somewhere by construction.

What a lineage means here. On the music maps the lineage is people moving between bands. Here it is how a place is made: the railroad arriving, the towns incorporating, the base, the speedway, the storm, the busway, the CRAs, the plans, the projects, the developers who move from one project to the next, the employers that anchor a district, the families and institutions that have been there for generations, and the newcomers. Trace lineage on the interactive map follows the solid lines upstream and downstream.

Inclusion rules. A node is on the map when it carries a founding, opening, incorporation or occurrence year with a source and at least one documented link to another node. A developer or firm is on the map only with a documented role on a named project; residence alone is never enough. Projects are worded as approved, under construction, delivered or announced from the filing that says so, never as built until a public record says built. Superlatives are qualified: within this dataset, in the project's reading. The owner's BusinessFlare® client work in South Dade stays out of this reference product; only public documents are used, including public CRA plans cited as public documents.

The ten layers

TOWNS AND DISTRICTS · 22

The four municipalities, Homestead (1913), Florida City (1914), Palmetto Bay (2002) and Cutler Bay (2005), the census designated places from Perrine and Richmond Heights to Goulds, Princeton, Naranja, Leisure City and the Redland, the railroad towns they grew from, and the storms that reshaped them.

EMPLOYMENT ANCHORS · 17

Homestead Air Reserve Base, Homestead Miami Speedway, Turkey Point, the two hospitals, Miami Dade College Homestead, Southland Mall, the farmers market, the nurseries and packing houses, the airport and the logistics buildings.

Timeline placement. On the lineage view and in the Play animation a place, institution, project or event enters at its founding, opening, incorporation or occurrence year and a person or family at their first documented act, taken from the earliest dated relation on the map. A node with no recorded year enters at the first year the map documents it and never earlier; the interactive panel labels these under Placed at, and the Nodes sheet carries the basis in its Place year basis column. A node with no dated link at all enters at the cutoff year. Influence relations never date a node.

Geography. The Cities view uses a basemap cut from Miami-Dade County open data: municipal boundaries for Homestead, Florida City, Cutler Bay and Palmetto Bay, the 2010 census designated places, the South Dade Transitway from the SMART Plan corridor layer, the county bus stop points on the corridor, US 1, Krome Avenue, the Turnpike extension, Palm Drive, Campbell Drive and Old Cutler Road from the major roads layer, the two national parks and the coastal municipal boundary for the shoreline. Every node is pinned at its address or centroid; a node with no address sits at its community's centroid and says so. Nodes that span the whole corridor sit in Biscayne Bay and outside actors further out, so neither is mistaken for a place. The countywide context stays off the map; South Dade is the whole frame.

What the map shows. South Dade has many documented destinations and one major historic gathering cluster in downtown Homestead. The mapped pattern is dispersed: 58 documented gathering places, 20 within 600 metres of a Transitway station, 2 clusters of three or more, and 24 standing alone. The map documents fragmentation and uneven concentration; the detection's argument about belonging remains an interpretation of that pattern.

Community hubs. Community hubs are map geography, not incorporated status. They include four municipalities, census designated places, historical or unincorporated communities (Perrine and the Redland), the corridor wide South Dade hub, and Outside South Dade. A node is assigned to the hub containing its address or, where no address is available, the documented community or a stated centroid. The Nodes sheet carries the hub type of every node.

Network interpretation. Node size on the map and the centrality figures in this document are computed on this dataset with every edge type weighted equally and parallel edges counted separately, community hubs and located links excluded. They describe position in the map, not size, budget or importance; an employer with one anchoring link is small however many people it employs. A ranked table and the counting method are in the Network metrics section.

PEOPLE AND POPULATION · 39

The population series for the eight ZCTAs, the founders and families with a documented act, from Henry Perrine and Henry Flagler to William Krome, Gaston Drake, Lyman Gould, Frank Martin, Charles Deering and the Redland farm families, and the mayors and officials who moved between institutions.

TRANSIT AND ROADS · 47

The Florida East Coast Railway of 1904, US 1, Krome Avenue, the Turnpike extension, the busway of 1997 that became the Transitway, its sixteen stations, the bus rapid transit service of 2025, the trolleys and circulators.

AGRICULTURE AND THE REDLAND · 42

Redland Market Village, Knaus Berry Farm, Robert Is Here, Schnebly, Cauley Square, Coral Castle, Monkey Jungle, the Fruit and Spice Park, the research stations, the Urban Development Boundary, the farmworker institutions and the county's agricultural economy.

GATHERING PLACES AND CULTURE · 39

Downtown Homestead and Krome Avenue, the Seminole Theatre, the Cybrarium, Losner Park, the rodeo, the cultural arts center in Cutler Bay, the restaurants of standing, the churches, the parades and festivals, the civic halls.

DEVELOPMENT AND CAPITAL · 104

Keys Gate, Waterstone, Lakes by the Bay and the master planned communities, Southplace City Center, Homestead Station, the apartment filings along US 1 and the Transitway, the logistics parks, and the developers, lenders and programs with a documented role on each.

PARKS, WATER AND RECREATION · 32

Everglades and Biscayne National Parks, Zoo Miami on the old naval air station, the Deering Estate, Homestead Bayfront and Black Point marinas, the county parks and the Everglades restoration works on the bay.

PLANS AND AGENCIES · 26

Miami-Dade County and DTPW, the five CRAs, the CDMP and the UDB, the SMART Plan and the Rapid Transit Zone, the base reuse plans, the watershed study, the downtown plans of Homestead, Cutler Bay and Palmetto Bay, We Will Rebuild and the federal recovery.

THE DIGITAL LAYER · 3

The digital layer records only public, locally rooted information infrastructure that the sources establish as South Dade serving: the South Dade News Leader, Miami's Community Newspapers and Palmetto Bay's government channel. Its thinness reflects the current source set, not a claim that digital community life is absent.

HOW THE PLACE WAS MADE

The railroad and the towns, 1895 to 1930. Henry Flagler's Florida East Coast Railway reaches Homestead in 1904 and the towns of South Dade are laid out along it: Goulds as a siding named for a railroad employee in 1903, Naranja as a Flagler town in 1904, Princeton as a depot named by Gaston Drake for his alma mater, Homestead at the railhead where William D. Horne buys the first lot. Homestead incorporates in 1913 as the second oldest municipality in the county and the Detroit colony founded by the Tatum brothers in 1910 becomes Florida City at incorporation on 29 December 1914. The Redland is settled from 1897 and its schoolhouse opens in 1904; the Overseas Railroad continues to Key West in 1912; US 1 is designated over the Dixie Highway in 1926. The 1926 and 1935 hurricanes and the end of the Keys line close the era. [R17] [R15] [T1]

The base, the parks and the subdivisions, 1940 to 1980. Homestead Army Air Field opens on 16 September 1942 and returns as Homestead Air Force Base in February 1955. Everglades National Park is dedicated in December 1947 with its main entrance west of Homestead; Biscayne National Monument follows in 1968 after the Seadade refinery and the Islandia resort are defeated, and becomes a park in 1980. Richmond Heights is platted in 1949 for returning Black veterans beside the old naval air station, whose land later takes Zoo Miami in 1980. The Cutler Ridge subdivisions are platted from 1954 and Cutler Ridge Shopping Center opens in 1960; Turkey Point's first units open in 1967 and its nuclear units in 1972 and 1973; the Turnpike extension arrives in 1973 and 1974; the Urban Development Boundary first appears on the county's 1975 land use map. The storm, August 1992. Hurricane Andrew makes landfall at Elliott Key and then near Homestead early on 24 August 1992 with winds of about 165 mph. It destroys more than 63,500 houses and damages more than 124,000 others in Dade County, leaves about 175,000 people homeless and causes about 25.3 billion dollars of damage in Florida in 1992 dollars. Most of the buildings at the air force base are severely damaged, four of five Naranja Lakes condominium buildings are destroyed, Florida City loses more than 120 homes, the Cutler Ridge Mall is nearly destroyed, Zoo Miami loses its aviary and 5,000 trees, the Deering Estate and the Fruit and Spice Park are wrecked, the visitor centres of both national parks are lost. On this map 155 nodes enter before 1992 and 216 from 1992 onward; 23 carry the Andrew flag because the sources record their destruction and rebuilding. [T36] [T37]

The rebuilding, 1992 to 2007. We Will Rebuild convenes in 1992 under Alvah Chapman; the Homestead CRA is created on 7 June 1994 and the Florida City CRA in 1995; the base reopens as a reserve installation in 1994 and survives the 1995 closure round; the Homestead Air Base Developers airport plan of 1996 ends with the Air Force's Record of Decision in January 2001. Homestead Miami Speedway opens on 3 November 1995 as the recovery project Homestead recruits. The South Miami-Dade Busway opens on 3 February 1997 on 8.2 miles of the abandoned railroad right of way from Dadeland South to Cutler Ridge Mall, reaches SW 264th Street in April 2005 and Florida City in December 2007. The Naranja Lakes CRA is created in October 2002 for the area that took a decade to recover. Palmetto Bay incorporates in September 2002 and Cutler Bay in 2005, both campaigns born of the recovery. The growth decade and the Transitway, 2010 to 2026. The eight ZCTA series rises from 191,276 in the 2010 Census to 265,396 in the ACS 2020 to 2024 five year estimate; the largest increase between consecutive displayed series points is 23,391, between the 2010 Census and ACS 2011 to 2015, and the latest displayed step is 10,273. The SMART Plan of April 2016 names the corridor, the county's transportation planning board chooses bus rapid transit over Metrorail in August 2018, construction runs from 2021 and Metro Express BRT service begins on 27 October 2025 with fourteen new stations. The Rapid Transit Zone is extended along the corridor in September 2022. Southland Mall's 80 acres change hands in May 2022 and the Southplace City Center redevelopment breaks ground on 27 February 2025; Homestead Station opens in 2019 and the Cybrarium in March 2021 in downtown Homestead; Keys Gate III, Amazon's Naranja building and the apartment filings along US 1 fill the capital lane. 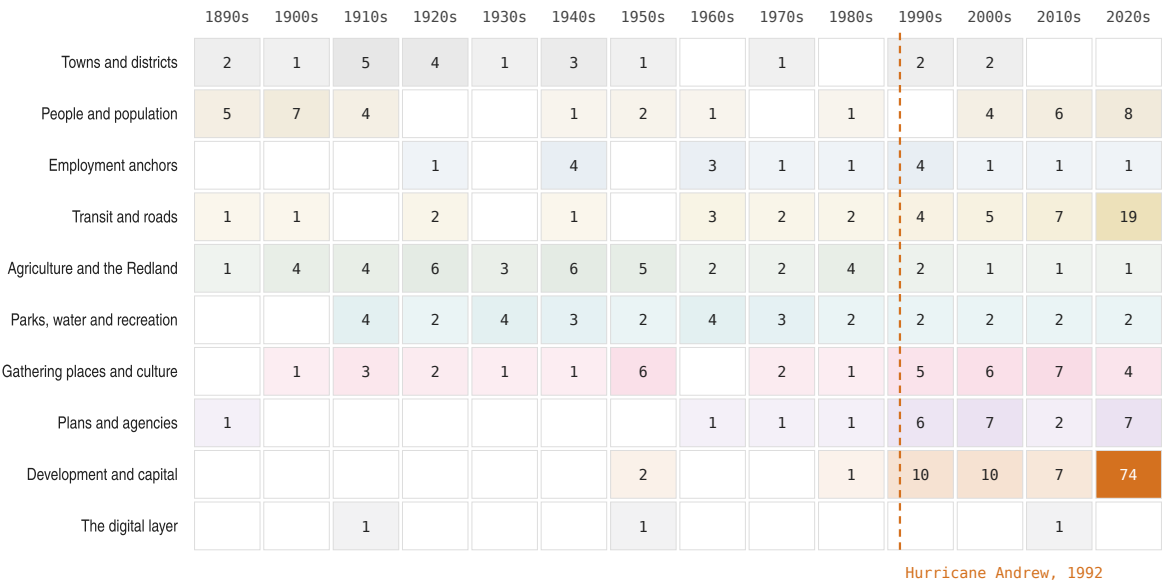


Figure 1. Nodes entering the map by decade and layer, from the year each node is placed at. Computed from the dataset. The orange line marks 1992.

THE POPULATION SERIES, EIGHT ZCTAS

The map's population figures are its own and are stated so they can be reproduced. The geography is the eight ZIP Code Tabulation Areas (ZCTAs) 33030, 33031, 33032, 33033, 33034, 33035, 33170 and 33189, which cover Homestead, Florida City, the Redland, Princeton and Naranja, Leisure City, Goulds and east Cutler Bay. The figures are the 2010 and 2020 Census counts and the American Community Survey five year total population (table B01003) for each vintage, summed across the eight areas. The set omits west Cutler Bay (33190) and the communities north of SW 136th Street that share ZIP codes with places outside the frame (Palmetto Bay, Perrine, Richmond Heights, South Miami Heights and Palmetto Estates in 33157, 33176, 33177 and 33187), so the series understates the population of the full frame and is a consistent measure of its southern and central core rather than a total. The eight ZCTA series rises from 191,276 in the 2010 Census to 265,396 in the ACS 2020 to 2024 five year estimate. The largest increase between consecutive displayed series points is 23,391, between the 2010 Census and ACS 2011 to 2015. The latest displayed step is 10,273. 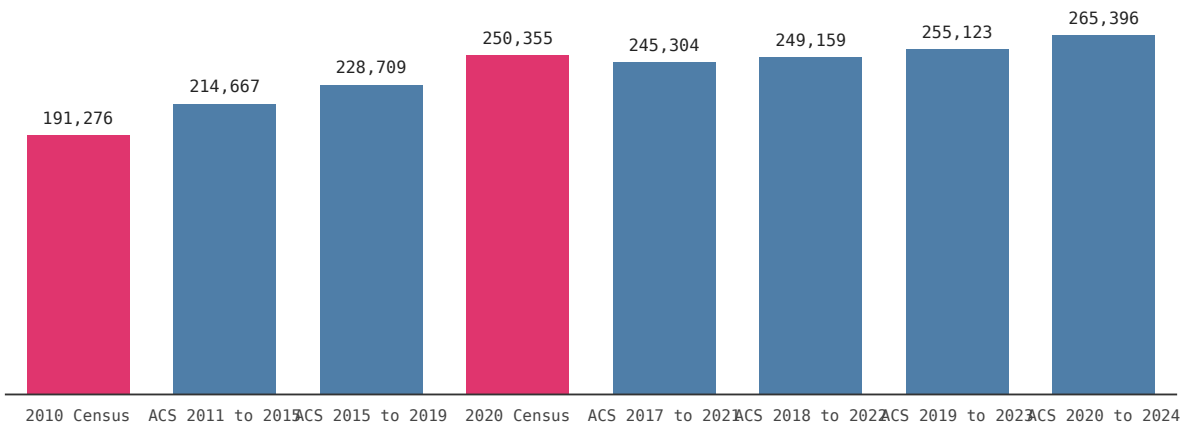


Figure 2. Population of the eight ZCTAs. Rose bars are decennial Census counts; blue bars are ACS five year estimates labelled by the last year of their window. Computed from the dataset.

The communities

Decennial counts and the latest estimate for each community hub, with the number of nodes the map places in it. Perrine has no count of its own after 2002, when East Perrine went into Palmetto Bay; the Redland CDP exists only for the 2010 Census. Counts by community are nodes on this map, not the size of each community's economy.

WHERE THE ANCHORS ARE

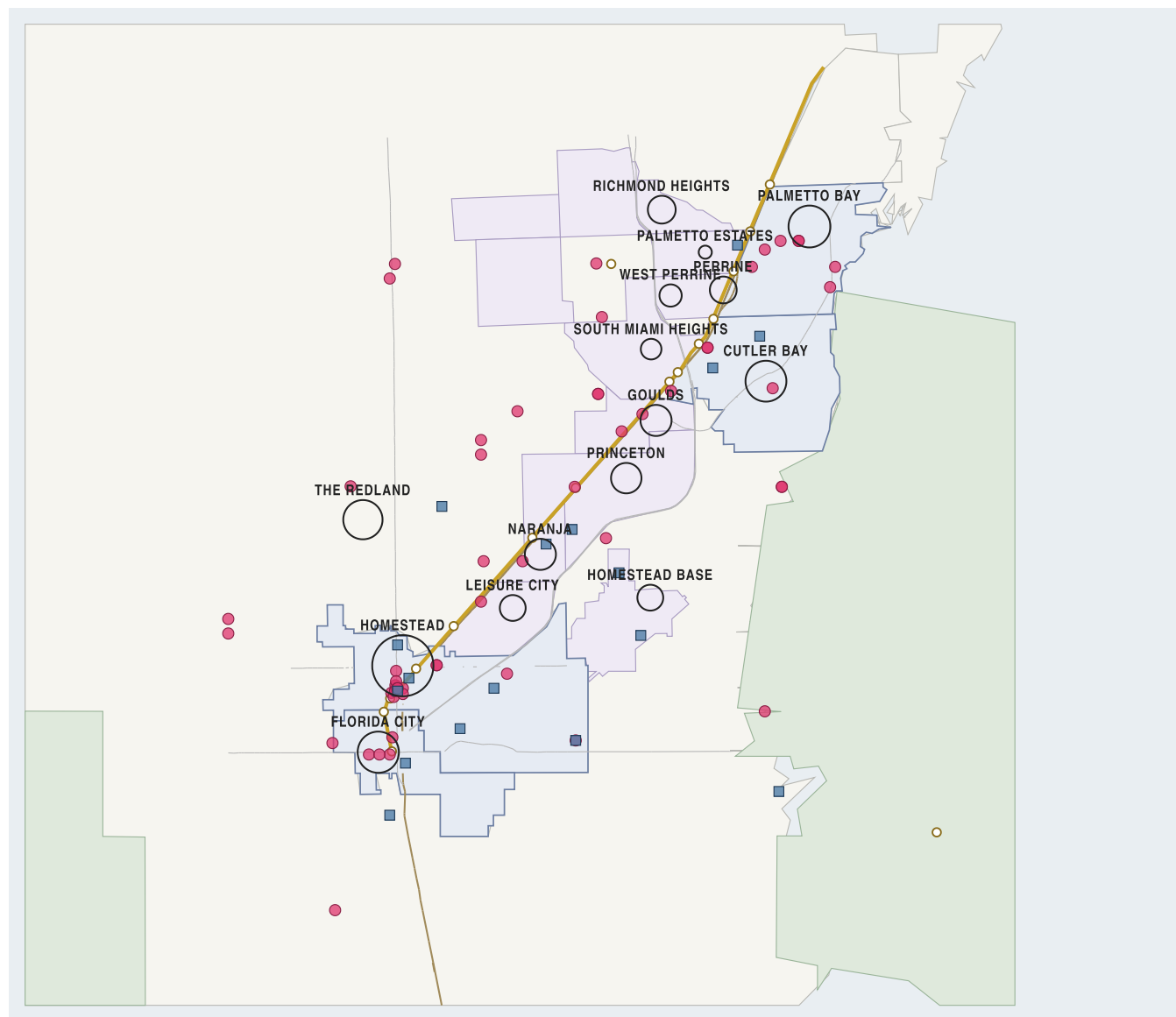


Figure 3. South Dade basemap from Miami-Dade County open data with the community hubs, gathering places (rose), employment anchors (blue) and Transitway stations (white). Nodes pinned only at a community centroid are omitted from this figure.

Figure 3 is the Cities view of the interactive map drawn for print: the communities as open circles sized by the number of nodes the map places in them, the 58 gathering places as rose dots at their addresses, the employment anchors as blue squares, the Transitway in gold with its stations, US 1 beside it, the national parks in green. The map shows where the documented anchors sit and lets the dispersion be measured; the detection's reading of that pattern is the detection's.

The pattern, as a computed dispersion. South Dade has many documented destinations and one major historic gathering cluster in downtown Homestead. The mapped pattern is dispersed: 58 documented gathering places pinned at an address, 20 within 600 metres of a Transitway station, 2 clusters of three or more within 600 metres of one another, and 24 standing alone. The largest cluster holds 15 gathering places, in Homestead: the historic downtown on Krome Avenue with its theatre, library, park, churches, museum and restaurants, and a station within walking distance. The market on US 1, the farms and stands of the Redland, the marinas, the parks and the rodeo each stand at their own address. The map documents fragmentation and uneven concentration; the detection's argument about belonging remains an interpretation of that pattern. A gathering place missing from the map is a gap in the sources, not evidence of absence.

OBSERVED AND ANNOUNCED

Every project on the map, worded from the filing or report that gives its status. Observed status is what the sources record as having happened by the cutoff date; announced, approved, proposed or under construction activity has not been confirmed as delivered. The Homestead CRA, the Naranja Lakes CRA and the Rapid Transit Zone appear in the plans layer and are cited as public documents.

HOW A PLACE GETS MADE

Six cases are singled out on the interactive map because each shows a different mechanism behind the detection's argument. A case is featured only when it rests on at least one official, plan or agency source, an independent source for any historical, financial or superlative claim, a date, a defined relationship or event, and a separation of completed from announced activity. Node size and centrality are computed from the dataset and are never adjusted for a case.

Hurricane Andrew

The reset that made the current place. Landfall near Homestead on 24 August 1992. 155 nodes on the map enter before that year and 216 from it onward; 23 nodes carry the Andrew flag because a source records their destruction and rebuilding. The recovery institutions, We Will Rebuild, the Homestead CRA, the speedway, the reserve base, the CRAs of Florida City and Naranja Lakes and the incorporations of Palmetto Bay and Cutler Bay, all enter within thirteen years of the storm. Evidence rule: the damage figures come from the National Hurricane Center and Wikipedia and every rebuilt node cites its own institution or the press for the rebuilding. [\[T36\]](#) [\[T37\]](#)

The Transitway

The spine that changed what is reachable. Railroad right of way of 1904, abandoned by 1989, bought by the state in 1988, opened as a busway on 3 February 1997, extended in 2005 and 2007, rebuilt from 2021 and running bus rapid transit from 27 October 2025 with fourteen new stations. 16 stations are on the map, each connected to the community it serves, and 20 gathering places sit within 600 metres of one. Evidence rule: DTPW's own project pages, the FTA profile, the TCRP report and the press; the vote tally of August 2018 is reported by one press source and worded as reported. Redland Market Village

The authentic non downtown. A family owned market on US 1 at SW 244th Street since 1987, 27 acres with a farmers market, an outdoor flea market, food trucks, a fish market and a nursery, at the intersection the SW 244 St station serves. On this dataset it carries 2 connections and no centrality, which is the point: the detection says people go there because it is the realest thing available, not because anything routes through it. Downtown Homestead

The one place trying to be a centre. The 1913 town centre on Krome Avenue, a National Register district since 2007, rebuilt after Andrew by the Main Street programme from 1993 and the CRA from 1994, with the Seminole Theatre reopened in 2015, Homestead Station in 2019, the Cybrarium in 2021 and Losner Park rebuilt by 2022. It is the largest cluster of gathering places on the map, 15 within 600 metres of one another. Evidence rule: the National Register listing, the city and CRA documents and the press for each project. The population series

The condition that is changing. The eight ZCTA series rises from 191,276 in the 2010 Census to 265,396 in the ACS 2020 to 2024 five year estimate; the largest increase between consecutive displayed series points is 23,391, between the 2010 Census and ACS 2011 to 2015, and the latest displayed step is 10,273. The 33032 and 33033 ZCTAs, Princeton, Naranja and Leisure City, carry most of the gain. Evidence rule: Census tables only, with the geography and the table stated on every node so the sum can be repeated. The missing centre

A dispersed pattern, documented. South Dade has many documented destinations and one major historic gathering cluster in downtown Homestead. The mapped pattern is dispersed: 58 documented gathering places, 20 within 600 metres of a Transitway station, 2 clusters of three or more, and 24 standing alone. The map documents fragmentation and uneven concentration; the detection's argument about belonging remains an interpretation of that pattern. Evidence rule: the same dataset as every other case, every gathering place with a sourced year, an address and a documented link; a place missing from the map is a gap in the sources.

WHO CARRIES THE CONNECTIONS

The figures below are computed on this dataset and nothing else. Degree is the number of edges attached to a node, with every edge type except located weighted equally and parallel edges counted separately; distinct is the number of different neighbours. Betweenness is the share of shortest paths between all other pairs of nodes that pass through the node, on the simple undirected graph; it rewards nodes that bridge otherwise separate parts of the map. Personnel betweenness repeats the calculation on the subgraph of moved, developed, spawned, founded and became edges only, the lineage proper. Community hubs and the located edges are excluded from both calculations because every node is located in a hub by construction. High degree at an agency or a plan means many nodes on the map pass through it, not that it is important beyond the map.

Moves and capital only

Restricting the graph to the moves and capital relations changes the ranking: South Miami-Dade Busway, Lennar, Waterstone, Florida Department of Transportation District Six and South Dade TransitWay are the highest betweenness nodes in this version of the dataset, and the developers active on two or more named projects (David Blumberg and Miracle Development Corporation, Lennar, Adrian Homes, Electra America, Atlantic Pacific Companies and Housing Trust Group) carry the bridges between projects. 11 of the 41 developers on the map have a documented role on two or more named projects.

CONFIDENCE AND SOURCES

Data are current through 11 September 2026. Every node was compiled from at least one reference, official, plan or press source and the 371 nodes cite 401 register entries: 126 press, 121 reference, 109 official, 30 database, 15 plan. A fact check pass verified the year, status wording and every dated or numeric claim of the seventy four most connected nodes and the case nodes against their cited sources, and its corrections are in the dataset; the sub claims it could not confirm are listed below. Each node carries a confidence grade in the index and in the interactive map: High means an official site, a public plan, a Census table or two press reports; Medium means Wikipedia or a single press report; Low means a year or detail the sources leave unconfirmed. Of the 371 nodes, 206 are High, 159 Medium and 6 Low. The preferred evidence for each kind of claim is set out below; where a claim rests on a weaker tier than its preferred one, the wording says reported.

Source hierarchy

Core chronology rests first on municipal archives, National Register records, county archives, state historical resources, the National Park Service, FDOT, Miami-Dade County, the Census and institutional histories. Wikipedia is a secondary locator and reference source, not the only support for core dates, incorporation claims, storm impacts, major infrastructure or landmark origins. Nodes that are central to a case, a top twenty metric, the towns layer or an Andrew flagged asset and that currently rest on reference sources alone are flagged for source upgrading in the Nodes sheet (23 nodes); none is removed for that reason.

Status taxonomy

Every node carries three fields. Entity status is operating, open, active, closed, dissolved, delivered, under construction, approved, proposed, announced or historical, as the sources word it; events, deceased people and defunct institutions are historical, never active. Historical state is pre Andrew, Andrew affected, rebuilt or replaced, post Andrew or not applicable, set from the year the node enters and the Andrew flag. The Andrew flag marks the storm itself and every node a source records as destroyed or heavily damaged in August 1992 and rebuilt or replaced.

Terminology and names

ZCTA means a Census ZIP Code Tabulation Area; the population series is a ZCTA series, not a USPS ZIP Code series. South Dade means the frame drawn on the Cities view: the four municipalities and the census designated places south of about SW 136th Street. Community hub means the municipality or census designated place a node sits in by address or centroid. The Transitway is the county's name for the corridor that opened as the South Miami-Dade Busway; the map uses both as the sources do. Developer means any firm or fund with a documented role on a named project, including lenders and land sellers where the source names them. Gathering place is the map's own flag for a documented place where people gather: a market, a theatre, a park, a main street, a festival, a church, a civic hall, a restaurant of standing. Compound descriptors are written without hyphens throughout as a house convention.

Open items

The following items are on the map with lower confidence or carry a sub claim the fact check could not confirm.

Lynda Bell: Lynda Bell is the Republican incumbent for County Commission District 8 when she loses to Daniella Levine Cava in 2014. She is reported to have been mayor of Homestead before her 2
Cutler Ridge Park and Pool: Cutler Ridge Park is a 10 acre town park at 10100 SW 200th Street west of Coral Sea Road beside Cutler Ridge Elementary, with lighted fields, a recreation building, pavilion and pl
Bill Sadowski Park and Nature Center: Bill Sadowski Park is a 30 acre county preserve near Palmetto Bay with pineland, tropical hardwood hammock and a drained Everglades slough, limestone solution holes and arches, a n
Homestead Air Reserve Park: Homestead Air Reserve Park covers 212.7 county acres in south Miami-Dade with soccer fields and picnic shelters, and hosts Soccerland Park with youth academies and six lighted synt
Coral Reef Park: Coral Reef Park at 7895 SW 152nd Street is Palmetto Bay's main village park. It gains a new volleyball court in December 2023, hosts the Palmetto Bay Artisan and Farmers Market eve
UF IFAS Extension Miami-Dade County: The University of Florida IFAS Extension office for Miami-Dade County sits at 18710 SW 288th Street in the Redland, near the Tropical Research and Education Center, and acts as the
South Corridor Rapid Transit Project: The 15 to 7 vote tally of the 30 August 2018 TPO vote is not in the cited WLRN article, which gives the BRT cost as \$243 million; the \$1.3 billion rail estimate is supported by Miami Today (R10, \$1.332 billion).
Biscayne National Park: That Congress named the Dante Fascell Visitor Center in 1998 is not in the cited Wikipedia or npplan pages; Wikipedia only records a commemorative plaque in 2002.
Charles Deering: The 60 million dollar 1922 valuation of the art collection is not in any cited source (Wikipedia Deering Estate, Clio, Palmetto Bay).

OPEN ITEM

William J. Krome: The 1902 to 1903 survey years and Krome's 1929 death are not in the cited Overseas Railroad or Homestead Wikipedia pages, which give only the route choice and the 1905 construction start.
Perrine Grant: The 1909 division year and the Model Land Company role are not in the cited sources; Wikipedia gives the acreages without a year and the Cutler Bay page says the dispute was resolved in 1897.
We Will Rebuild: The 1994 dissolution year is not documented in any cited source (the note already says so); the \$27 million raised is confirmed by govtech (G53).
Urban Development Boundary: The supermajority requirement to move the UDB is not in the cited CDMP page or miamigeographic article; the 1975 and 1983 dates and the 2025 farmland acreages are confirmed.
Naranja Lakes Community Redevelopment Agency: The county special district page (G11) gives the creating ordinance as O-02-163 while the 2025 plan update (J43) gives 02-216, both dated 22 October 2002; the note follows the plan update.
Fruit and Spice Park: The Redland International Orchid Festival is confirmed only by the Redland Wikipedia page (A18), not by the park history page.
Naval Air Station Richmond: Acreage differs by source: 2,000 (NAS Richmond Wikipedia), 2,107 (Larry and Penny Thompson Park page) and 2,500 (Richmond Heights Wikipedia); the note keeps 2,000.
Florida Department of Transportation District Six: FDOT's 1969 creation year in the detail field is not covered by any cited source; the busway and bypass claims are confirmed.
1920s land boom in South Dade: The statement that the 1926 hurricane ended the boom is not explicit in the cited sources; the Florida City history says the boom collapsed in the late 1920s.
South Dade TransitWay: Original busway length is 8.2 miles in the TCRP and NBRTI reports but 8.3 miles on Wikipedia; the note keeps 8.2.
